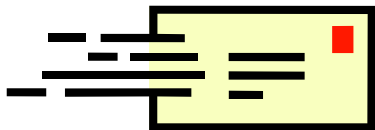

Wireless communication is made possible by computer networking technology that uses high frequency radio signals to exchange information between a laptop computer and a dedicated hardware device that provides the Internet connection. In the library, this access appliance is located behind the circulation desk.

There is no charge to use this service, but library users must provide their own laptop, wireless card, and software.

Printing is not available from the wireless network.

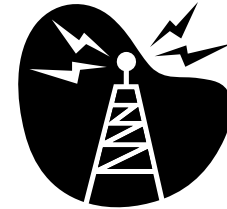


The library's wireless network downloads at 1.5 Mbps and uploads at 384 Kbps

The library's wireless Internet network is not secure. Eavesdropping is possible using specialized equipment. Users are encouraged to use standard security practices with regard to passwords and credit card information.



By using the library's wireless Internet network the user is agreeing to appropriate provisions of the Craven-Pamlico-Carteret Regional Library's Internet Use Agreement. Copies of the IUA are available at the circulation desk. Abbreviated versions of the policy are posted on each public use computer.



Connecting to the Wireless Network

Many newer laptops have built in wireless capability which automatically alerts the user to the presence of a wireless network when the Internet browser is launched. Other computers may require some configuration. For complex issues consult your owner's manual or contact your manufacturer's support web site. Library staff can only ensure the network is running and answer basic instructions for connecting.
